into college, find good jobs and lead healthy lives.



NEIGHBORHOOD SNAPSHOT

SDPromise supports the neighborhoods of Barrio Logan, Logan Heights and San Ysidro. The areas are comprised of about 13,000 family households and are greatly affected by immigration, transience, poverty, crime, low educational expectancy and homelessness as well as political, economic and cultural isolation.

More learning takes place during the first five years than at any other period in life, with 90 percent of a child's brain developed by this time. Many SDPromise Neighborhood families have limited access and opportunities to enroll their children in quality early learning programs. Our teams help children prepare to thrive in kindergarten by supporting the emotional and cognitive development skills needed to succeed.

ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL

Research shows that quality after-school programs improve school achievement. Students who participate in these programs are more likely to be engaged in their regular lessons and earn better test scores and grades. Other studies have shown that students in after-school programs make healthier choices: they are less likely to get into fights; have children of their own at a young age; use drugs; commit crimes; or even gain unhealthy amounts of weight.

COLLEGE AND CAREER

Education is the single most effective way to end the cycle of inter-generational poverty. Data shows that a college graduate can earn 75 percent more than a high school graduate. Those with less than a high school degree are twice as likely to lose jobs than those with a high school degree and ten times more likely than those with a college degree. Our Career Academies and one-on-one support expose students to new pathways for planning their life after graduation.


